The exception to this is those covered under the Kaiser Permanente election which rose by \$115.00 which begins May 2023 hours for the non-Bargaining group. 

### **MANHOURS**

First quarter data is in, and things are trending up in 2023! March man hours were the highest recorded since the summer of 2019. If we continue to maintain the current monthly average, we are looking at a yearend estimate of over 3.1 million-man hours which would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest recorded man hours in our Local's history.

Dispatching Info - Zones 1 & 2 have been on somewhat of a waiting pattern, but when jobs are available, they are mostly filled by Book 1. Zone 3 has many calls with lots of Book 2's and some Book 3's. Roughly ½ of the Book 2's signing books are from 46 due to their trending of continued slowing work.




### WA CARES ACT PREPARATION – Payroll deductions begin July 1st!



Reminder that the Washington Cares Act is a new program that provides long-term care coverage for Washingtonians. Employers must start taking out .58% of employee paychecks starting July 1. It is important for employers to understand the program's details to ensure compliance. We hope you were able to join in on Employer Solutions Law's webinar that they

put together for employers to learn about the law, how exemptions work, become proficient in calculating, collecting, and remitting premiums and communicate the impending deductions to their workforce. ### **NWEJATC APPRENTICESHIP NEWS**

### 2022-23 Apprentice School Year Update:

Classes ended in Mt Vernon but are still going through June in East Wenatchee. The west side instructors are continuing to support the new instructors in Wenatchee, prepping for next year, and taking several weeks of voluntary furlough through mid-July.

The JATC staff are making great progress in their efforts to settle in at WATTS. The new instructors are doing well in their positions and the WATTS building is working as planned.

First year classes are continuing the transition to computer mediated learning (CML), more asynchronous learning. This change is resulting in better learning outcomes, more homework, and more in-class labs & hands-on activities.

## REMINDER: Apprenticeship only law (to qualify for 01 exam)

Effective July 1, 2023, a new law changes Washington's approach to journey level (01) electrician certification to an apprenticeshiponly model. This change effects trainees who perform 01 work and their employers.

### **CEU Classes Update:**

It's been nearly a year since the NWEJATC Committee approved the motion to temporarily cease the instruction of CEU classes due to the lack of funds and resources. With the new funding secured and in place with the increases effective June 1<sup>st</sup> and the planning put forth by Training Director Rob Bartel, the NWEJATC is on course to resume in person and online CEUs this fall.

### **Grant Updates:**

- LNI Apprenticeship Grant provided the following:
  - For WATTS:
    - Four GREENLEE EMT/IMC/Rigid Benders (Triple Nickels) and associated shoes
    - One RIDGID COMPACT THREADER WITH 250 STAND
  - For both training sites
    - Grant updating/adding: server & instructor laptops, classroom AV equipment
- In more positive news the apprenticeship was awarded an Electrical Training Alliance grant to offer pre-apprenticeship, planning for a class to start in the late fall or winter.

### **Apprenticeship Numbers:**

- 521 current apprentices (as of 5/1):
  - 413 Inside Wireman Apprentices, with 2 west & 4 east available for assignment and 16 new (8 west, 8 east) – awaiting first assignments.
  - 92 Limited Energy Apprentices, with 8 west & 0 east available for assignment and
     2 new (2 west, 4 east) awaiting first assignments.
  - o 16 Residential Wireman Apprentices, with one available for assignment.

### **2023 W.A.V.E. TOUR**



N.W.E.J.A.T.C. participated in the annual W.A.V.E. (Washington Apprentice Vocational Education) Tour for a few days in April at the Northwest Carpenter's Institute of Washington training center in Burlington. The whole point of the tour is to show high school students that there are other career options besides a 4-year degree.

Various trades were represented, including carpenters, construction laborers, operating engineers, electricians, and sheet metal workers. Each day a different set of high school students participated in hands-on activities that introduced students

to what apprentices may do in the various trades.



N.W.E.J.A.T.C. had a Conduit Bending Station where our apprentices spent a couple of hours each day teaching the high school students their craft. "This is the first time for many of our apprentices to explain a simple task to someone who knows nothing about what

doing. are This exposure allows them an practice opportunity to being journeyman, instructing а new apprentice," says Rob Bartel, N.W.E.J.A.T.C. Training Director.
