The PLC is far more than just writing a check. Its members have specific opportunities to:





The Electrical Project Su-

pervision program has been developed as three integrated components. Each of the three levels addresses the same topical areas, but successive levels are built upon the foundations established at earlier levels. All three program levels are designed to provide important learning and skills for supervisors with a wide range of responsibilities.

While some material in one level may be "beyond" what most foremen might need to accomplish their immediate responsibilities, it enriches their understanding of the business and process of construction and gives them insight into what might be ahead as they move up the administrative ladder. Course topics include defining the supervisor's role, team building, verbal communication, written communication, performance management, safety, production management, planning and scheduling, tool and material management, employee relations, and understanding cost.

BRINKS L & I TRAVEL PAY POLICY


L & I just released the new policy regarding travel pay as a result of the 2007 Washington State Supreme Court decision in the Brinks lawsuit. The first $4 \frac{1}{2}$ pages of the administrative policy are the policies regarding travel pay during the commute.

Our contractor coalition has been working with L & I on this policy for the past 6 months. NECA recommends that contractors review the policy to begin formulating any changes you may feel are necessary to abide by the

new rules.



Work-Smart Tip

Gone fishing... efficiently. It can be a problem trying to fish a wire down the inside of an insulated wall to attach conductors to a device or outlet no matter what tool you use. A simple and inexpensive 60ounce Torpedo fishing weight tied to a jet line string could help do the trick. This type of weight has an eye molded into both ends, so once it drops to the cutout, you tie the wire to the end for the upward feed. The "torpedo" shape combined with the weight easily helps it drop past typical fiberglass insulation. If this doesn't work, just pull it partway back up and let it free-fall down to get through areas of packed insulation of bats. You can buy these weights at fishing tackle stores of online at <u>www.torpedofishingweight.com</u>.
